Transformational Learning

Teaching for Transformation (TfT) is a framework that helps our staff intentionally integrate faith into all areas of learning, making our school distinctively Christian. TfT is a collection of tools and best practices that lead to transformational learning experiences. These learning experiences invite, nurture, and empower teachers and students to play their part in God's story through their everyday learning.

We are unified in God's story, but each of us has a different role. Each student, teacher, and parent is uniquely gifted to serve in God's Kingdom and we all have a role to play in His big story. Our goal is to help each student discover these gifts in order to fulfill their purpose in the story.

*Full-day preschool can be substituted for either Pre-3 or Pre-4 and meets the goals of three- and four-year-old learners.



Preschool Learning

Curriculum

Preschool goals are met through a child-centered approach to learning. We use The Creative Curriculum for Preschool to guide us in accomplishing our goals. Preschool is a time for children to explore through structured and unstructured work and play, individually and in groups. Our program provides daily Bible stories and songs, exposure to books, language experiences, physical activities for large and small muscle control, hands-on math, music, listening activities, pre-writing tasks, art projects, field trips, presentations by community speakers, and other activities which help us meet the needs of the learners in our classrooms.

The curriculum contains 36 learning objectives which are based on widely-held expectations for development and learning. The teacher is able to assess each child's development and respond by providing individualized, differentiated learning experiences. The environment and methods in every room are designed to fully support the learning of 3-, 4-, and 5-year-old students.

Learning

Our program contains a variety of activities:

- Large Group Time: A collaborative, whole learning community gathering which could include; listening to a story, participating in a music and movement activity, or discussing a topic the children are studying.
- Small Group Time: Teacher-led intentional learning activities. Children participate in the
 activities at their current level of skills and abilities and are supported as they learn to
 master the next level of learning in groups of two to four students. Activities focus on
 math and literacy development and can include physical, cognitive, or social learning
 focuses as well. Learning is differentiated and individualized to support the achievement
 of each individual learner.
- Free Choice Time: Children are engaged in using their developmental skills and abilities in playful, inquiry-based learning in the Interest Areas of the room which include Games and Puzzles, Sensory Table, Discovery (Science) Table, Art Area, Music and Movement Area, Library, Dramatic Play, and Block Area.
- Bible stories and worship time.
- Outdoor time.

Note: Math and literacy skills are developed and mastered over time through frequent exposure and guided practice. Research tells us that both math and literacy skills develop in an expected progression, but the time it takes to move through the progression of development, and the methods which are most effective for each learner to gain mastery of skills vary depending on each individual. In response, we follow research-based best practices, which dictate that we should re-visit learning objectives many times throughout each year of your child's preschool experience and immerse your child in a playful, handson, inquiry-based environment. This helps us ensure that every learner receives an excellent educational program that allows them to progress and develop math and literacy skills at their own pace.

Curriculum

The goal of the kindergarten program at Byron Center Christian School is to build eager, life-long learners of God's remarkable creation who are emotionally, spiritually, and intellectually motivated to glorify Jesus and bear His image in their daily walk with Him. Our kindergarten classes mark the beginning of an exciting, Christ-centered educational experience.

There will be daily prayer, times of singing in the classroom, and chapel opportunities.

Academic

In preschool, we want students to find joy in their learning! We use <u>The Creative Curriculum</u> to foster the growth of the whole child. In the classroom, students will explore, discover, create, question, play, and more as part of their play-based learning environments. Students will spend time in a variety of learning centers. Math and literacy skills are developed and mastered over time through frequent exposure and guided practice. Teachers will always meet each individual learner exactly where they are so we can help them grow.

Social-Emotional

One of the most important things in Preschool-3 is the development of students' social and emotional skills. A primary reason we find preschool so important is because it allows children to practice the ability to interact with both peers and teachers. We also work to help students grow in their confidence and independence. Teachers work to help students understand how they are feeling, develop friendship skills, regulate their emotions, and practice restorative relationship skills.

At Byron Center Christian School, all grades and teachers utilize the <u>Teaching for Transformation (TfT)</u> framework to ensure an excellent education that is rooted in God's Word and prepares our students for service in God's Kingdom. TfT is the tool we use to provide an authentic Christian education for students to both see and live God's story. Specific to preschool, we use the Creative Curriculum as well to ensure all learners develop in play-based learning environments.

In Place-Based Preschool, most of a student's day will be spent outdoors and engaged in outdoor learning. They will also have learning experiences in other places including their traditional indoor classroom, places at our East Campus (the woods and other various ecosystems surrounding our East Campus), places in our local community, and beyond! In essence, this program takes TfT practices, and our preschool curriculum, and allows students to learn outdoors or in whatever place best enriches their growth.

Junior kindergarten is specifically designed for children who need the gift of time prior to their kindergarten experience. All children grow and develop differently and junior kindergarten gives students an extra year following preschool. This program strives to foster confidence, an independent initiative for learning, self-discipline, consideration for others, accountability for one's actions, and intellectual growth. By nurturing these qualities, a positive self-image is developed in each child. With hands-on activities, the students learn by having fun. The curriculum and daily structure are aligned with preschool.

Curriculum and Goals

Junior kindergarten uses The Creative Curriculum to meet the unique needs of students who have already completed a preschool program but require time to fully develop their skills before kindergarten entry. Teachers reinforce preschool concepts and challenge each student to take their next step of development in language, literacy, math, cognitive, and social-emotional learning. Students practice and demonstrate their knowledge, skills, and abilities through engagement in inquiry-based learning.

Spiritual

Teachers share their faith on a daily basis with students. There will be times of prayer, devotions, and chapel opportunities, as well a time for Bible stories. Teachers utilize the TfT framework to help students begin to understand how they can use all they learn to live out their unique role in God's story. We want them to see in authentic ways that what we do each day matters!

Academic

Junior kindergarten uses The Creative Curriculum to build on preschool learning. The Creative Curriculum is a comprehensive, research-based tool that features exploration and discovery as a way of learning, enabling children to develop confidence, creativity, and lifelong critical-thinking skills. The first six weeks are spent learning procedures and how we do school at BCCS. Other topics students learn about include insects, roads, bread, boxes, gardening, and more!

Social-Emotional

Junior kindergarten students will spend time working on their social skills development. They will continue to develop important skills for peer interaction in collaborative learning environments. Students gain confidence in self-care by following routines and practicing independence in caring for their own needs. Teachers use principles of Love and Logic as they coach peer interactions. Positive and courteous behavior is modeled and practiced throughout the day.

Curriculum and Goals

Kindergarten teachers, like preschool, will use the TfT framework to connect faith and learning. Each child is uniquely made in God's image, and teachers work to meet their unique needs. The focus continues to be on whole child development, but there is now also more time spent on specific academic disciplines.

Teaching for Transformation

Every teacher at BCCS has a deep hope for their students, and kindergarten builds on preschool development by introducing students to God's story. Teachers use learning targets to connect important academic goals and faith incorporation. We also want students to see the ways they are unique in their role as they learn more about God's world in each subject. Each student, teacher, and parent is gifted to serve in God's Kingdom, and we all have a role to play in His big story. Our goal is to help each student discover these gifts in order to fulfill their purpose in the story.

Learning

- Math: We use the Math Expressions curriculum which promotes a solid understanding of numbers through hands-on activities, games, and problem-solving. After students have solid number sense, they learn to see the ten in teen numbers, addition and subtraction, and 2-D and 3-D shapes.
- Literacy: We recognize that children advance through learning stages at different rates. With our literacy program, each child is poised to develop at his or her own pace as they are introduced to strategies to become fluent readers. Writing is a component of our literacy program as the way we express ourselves and share our ideas with others. Students participate in Daily 5 activities (read to self, word work, writing) while the teacher works with small groups of students to meet specific needs. Each student has a personal writing journal in which to draw pictures and write stories. Students also participate in a variety of authentic writing experiences throughout the year.
- Science: Kindergarten science is presented in such a way that students not only observe the
 wonders of God's creation with bright eyes and open minds, but are encouraged to question why
 and how, and are further enabled to investigate the answers to those questions. We explore
 motion (pushes and pulls), weather, climate, plants, animals, and more.
- Bible: At the heart of all we do and teach is the great goal of wanting our students to mature in their faith. Our Bible curriculum aims to present the Bible as the story of God's acts and words, written so that His people might know God, accept His gift of salvation, and live lives of joyful service and obedience. We strive to plant the Word of God in the hearts of our students by learning the Bible ABC verses and Psalm 23, as well as other passages. Our goal is to encourage spiritual growth through knowledge of our great God, service opportunities, school chapels, prayer, devotionals, and our example and testimony.
- Social Studies: In our social studies units, students strengthen their sense of self as God's child and
 explore the importance of getting along with others and being responsible. We also lay the
 foundation for civics in subsequent grades, especially citizenship concepts. We emphasize that
 students are part of many different groups; therefore it's important that they learn to get along
 with others.
