

For over the past 100 years, BCCS has been diligently committed to providing an excellent education rooted in the word of God. This year we have five our teachers who are considered "early adopters" of our new initiative called "Teaching for Transformation." Teaching for Transformation (TfT) is an intentional framework that will help our staff continue to strengthen and enhance the <u>faith integration skills</u> used to make our school distinctively Christian.

TfT takes ten themes (referred to as throughlines by the framework) from God's word and uses them to help shape a student's understanding of the world. The ten themes include: God Worshiper, Truth Finder, Earth Keeper, Image Reflector, Beauty Creator, Justice Seeker, Creation Enjoyer, Servant Worker, Idolatry Discerner, Community Builder, and Order Discoverer. These themes are woven throughout the existing curriculum.

The goal is for the student to be able to not only develop an understanding of the "required"

academic content (i.e. Who is Martin Luther King Jr.?), but to see it through the lens of their Christian faith. For example, when considering the Justice Seeker theme, students will start to make connections between MLK's life experiences and their own. They will recognize that injustices still exist in our society, and like Martin Luther King Jr., they can be and are called to be God's agents of change, right now. The student is encouraged to not just be an "observer" but to SEE THE STORY.

The staff at BCCS will be using these ten themes to help students not only master required content; but more importantly, it will help the teachers present the content and provide authentic opportunities for students to practice how their hearts and minds can work in concert to bring about God's purposes and plans for the restoration of His Kingdom as they learn, live and work in God's Story.

Earlier in our preschool year we learned about sand: its characteristics, where we find it, what we make with sand, and who works with sand. We also talked about how sometimes sand is used on our roads in the wintertime to help keep us safe while we are driving After we learned about the TfT throughline of "Beauty Creator", we decided to be Beauty Creators by making hand prints out of sand dough and decorating them. We are going to take a field trip to the Kent County Road Commission at the end of February and give our hand prints to the workers as a way of encouraging them and saying thank you to them for working so hard to clean up our roads and keep us safe in the wintertime. Through this experience I hope that my students will begin to discover how they can follow Jesus and live for Him



by encouraging others and building them up.
